¹ Chs. 1-17 Title - Holiness: Yahweh is now living among the people. He is holy, therefore the people must be holy for Him to live among them. Their moral and bodily defilement must be cleansed and atoned for. Their physical defilement results, of course, from their moral defilement. To atone is to cover over, pacify, or make propitiation. It is related to the mercy seat (atonement seat) in Exodus 25, 27, and Leviticus 16. The noun, sometimes translated "ransom" is used in Exodus 21:30 ff. and in Ex. 30:12 (ransom or redemption or atonement money for the firstborn).

² Lev. 12:2b-4 - In the case of a baby boy: The total time of purification was forty days.

³ Lev. 12:5 - In the case of a baby girl: The total time of purification was eighty days. To our egalitarian western society this seems both unfair and needlessly discriminatory. But God cannot be accused of being either unfair or needlessly discriminatory.

The best explanation I have heard is that of <u>Thomas Constable</u>. Referencing Andrew A. Bonar, <u>A Commentary on Leviticus</u>, 5th edition (pp. 236-237), he states, "A fourth possibility is that the distinction resulted from the curse on Eve and her sex, that followed the Fall." He concludes, "I favor this interpretation."

[&]quot;Although this regulation is often taken as reflecting childbirth's problematical nature, the occasion is actually appointed by the Lord as one to remind the mother of her spiritual condition, through birth pain and her period of alienation from the sanctuary. Thus the prescription reaffirms the reality of the fall and its ongoing nature, which tends rarely to be considered by humanity."
