# A1 THE CALL FOR HELP 4:1

- B1 The Plea for Present Help: Answer me when I call, O God of my righteousness!
- B2 The Reminder of Past Help: You have relieved me in my distress;
- **B3** The Plea for Present Help Repeated: Be gracious to me and hear my prayer!

# A2 THE WARNING TO THE ENEMIES 4:2-5

### **B1** The Protest to Enemies 4:2

- C1 The shame of dishonor: O sons of men, how long will my honor become a reproach?<sup>2</sup>
- C2 The humiliation of deceit
  - D1 *How long* will you love what is worthless
  - D2 And aim at deception? <sup>3</sup> Selah.

### **B2** The Protection of Yahweh 4:3

- C1 Possession -- the Godly are Yahweh's Possession: But know that the LORD has set apart the godly man for Himself;
- C2 Response -- Yahweh Will Respond to the Cry of the Godly: The LORD hears when I call to Him.<sup>4</sup>

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> 4:3 - the LORD hears: It is almost as though David is warning his enemies to leave him alone because he has instant 911 access to the Divine police force!

## **B3** The Admonition to Trust in Yahweh 4:4-5

- C1 Fear Sin! Tremble, and do not sin; 4:4
- C2 Pause to Reflect! Meditate in your heart upon your bed, and be still. Selah.
- C3 Offer Fitting Sacrifices! Offer the sacrifices of righteousness, 4:5
- C4 Trust in Yahweh! And trust in the LORD.

## A3 THE JOY AND SECURITY FROM TRUSTING IN YAHWEH! 4:6-8

- **B1** The Pessimism of the Faint-Hearted: Many are saying, "Who will show us any good?" 4:6
- **B2** The Response of Faith in Yahweh: Lift up the light of Your countenance upon us, O LORD!
- **B3** The Joy from Trusting in Yahweh 4:7
  - C1 You have put gladness in my heart,
  - C2 More than when their grain and new wine abound.

### B4 The Security from Trusting in Yahweh 4:8

- C1 The evidence of security: In peace I will both lie down and sleep
- C2 The reason for security: For You alone, O LORD, make me to dwell in safety!
