A1 PRAISE FOR GOD'S POWER IN THE SPIRITUAL REALM 65:1-5

B1 Worthy of Praise 65:1

- C1 Meditative silence and vocal praise in Zion: 1 There will be silence before You, and praise in Zion, O God,
- C2 Keeping of vows: And to You the vow will be performed.

B2 Object of Universal Worship 65:2

- C1 Hearer of prayers: 2 O You who hear prayer,
- C2 The resort of all mankind: To You all men come.

B3 Forgiver of Sins 65:3

- C1 David prone to sin: 3 Iniquities prevail against me;
- C2 Israel corporate beneficiaries of God's pardon: As for our transgressions, You forgive them.

B4 Ultimate Relationship 65:4

- C1 David's blessedness at being chosen to be king and thus having ready access to worship in the sanctuary:
 - D1 4 How blessed is the one whom You choose ¹ and bring near to You
 - D2 To dwell in Your courts.
- C2 Corporate Israel's satisfaction with worship in God's house: We will be satisfied with the goodness of Your house, Your holy temple.

¹ 65:4 - "the one whom You choose": God chose David to be King of Israel, and David was privileged to exemplify true worship of God as evidenced by his many psalms. B5 Universal Source of Salvation 65:5

- C1 Israel's benefit from answered national prayer: 5 By awesome deeds You answer us in righteousness, O God of our salvation,
- C2 The future international trust in God: You who are the trust of all the ends of the earth and of the farthest sea;

B1 Mountain Builder 65:6

- C1 6 Who establishes the mountains by His strength,
- C2 Being girded with might;

B2 Conqueror of the Sea and People 65:7

- C1 Stiller of seas and waves
 - D1 7 Who stills the roaring of the seas,
 - D2 The roaring of their waves,
- C2 Stiller of the troubled nations, typified by troubled seas: ²And the tumult of the peoples.

B3 Painter of Sunrise and Sunset 65:8

- C1 Earth-dwellers in awe of God's artistry: 8 They who dwell in the ends of the earth stand in awe of Your signs;
- C2 Illustrated in sunrise and sunset: You make the dawn and the sunset shout for joy.

B4 Provider of Food 65:9-13

- C1 Waterer of the Land 65:9-10
 - D1 Provider of Moisture 65:9
 - E1 9 You visit the earth and cause it to overflow;
 - E2 You greatly enrich it;
 - E3 The stream of God is full of water;
 - E4 You prepare their grain, for thus You prepare the earth.

 - D2 Delicacy: And Your paths drip with fatness.
- C3 Rejoicer of Pastures and Meadows 65:12-13
 - D1 Pastures: 12 The pastures of the wilderness drip,
 - D2 Hills: And the hills gird themselves with rejoicing. 65:12
 - D3 Meadows and flocks: 13 The meadows are clothed with flocks
 - D4 Valleys and grain: And the valleys are covered with grain;
 - D5 Cause for joyful song: They shout for joy, yes, they sing. 65:13
