B1 Asaph's Disturbed Cry to Elohim 77:1-3

- C1 Audible Cry to Elohim 77:1
 - D1 Audible cry: {1} My voice rises to God, and I will cry aloud;
 - D2 Assurance of response: My voice *rises* to God, and He will hear me.
- C2 Seeking for Adonai with Discomfort of Soul 77:2
 - D1 Troubled seeking during the day: {2} In the day of my trouble I sought the Lord;
 - D2 Tireless reaching at night: In the night my hand was stretched out without weariness;
 - D3 Endless discomfort: My soul refused to be comforted.
- C3 Remembering Elohim with Disturbed Spirit 77:3
 - D1 Disturbed remembrance: {3} When I remember God, then I am disturbed;
 - D2 Sighing with faint-hearted spirit: *When* I sigh, then my spirit grows faint. Selah.

B2 Asaph's Troubled Meditation 77:4-6

- C1 The Depth of His Torment 77:4
 - D1 Elohim-Induced Sleeplessness: {4} You have held my eyelids open;
 - D2 Anguished Silence: I am so troubled that I cannot speak.

- C2 Reflecting on the Past 77:5
 - D1 {5} I have considered the days of old,
 - D2 The years of long ago.
- C3 His Nocturnal Meditations 77:6
 - D1 Structured in Song: {6} I will remember my song in the night;
 - D2 Meditating: I will meditate with my heart,
 - D3 Pondering: And my spirit ponders:
- C4 Questioning Whether Adonai Elohim's Rejection is Permanent 77:7-9
 - D1 Will Adonai reject forever? 77:7
 - E1 {7} Will the Lord reject forever?
 - E2 And will He never be favorable again?
 - D2 Have His loyal love and promise ceased forever? 77:8
 - E1 {8} Has His lovingkindness ceased forever?
 - E2 Has *His* promise come to an end forever?
 - D3 Has Elohim forgotten His gracious compassion? 77:9
 - E1 {9} Has God forgotten to be gracious,
 - E2 Or has He in anger withdrawn His compassion? Selah.

ASAPH'S DECISION TO REMEMBER GOD'S FAITHFULNESS IN THE PAST THOUGH IT SEEMS HIS POLICY HAS CHANGED 77:10-15

- B1 His Sad Conclusion That the Policy of the Most High Has Changed 77:10
 - C1 His sadness: {10} Then I said, "It is my grief,
 - C2 His conclusion: That the right hand of the Most High has changed."
- B2 His Decision to Remember Yahweh's Past Actions 77:11
 - C1 His deeds: {11} I shall remember the deeds of the LORD;
 - C2 His ancient wonders: Surely I will remember Your wonders of old.

B3 His Resolve to Meditate on God's Ways 77:12

- C1 On His work: {12} I will meditate on all Your work
- C2 On His deeds: And muse on Your deeds.

B4 His Praise of Elohim's Holiness and Greatness 77:13

- C1 Elohim's holy way: {13} Your way, O God, is holy;
- C2 Elohim's unparalleled greatness: What god is great like our God?

B5 Elohim Works Wonders and Demonstrates His Strength 77:14

- C1 Elohim's miracles: {14} You are the God who works wonders;
- C2 His revelation of His strength: You have made known Your strength among the peoples.

B6 God's Redemption of Israel 77:15

- C1 His powerful redemption of His people: {15} You have by Your power redeemed Your people,
- C2 The identification of His people: The sons of Jacob and Joseph. Selah.

A3 ELOHIM'S SOVEREIGN ACTIVITY ON BEHALF OF HIS PEOPLE AT THE RED SEA 77:16-20

B1 The Sovereignty of Elohim in Nature 77:16-18

- C1 Causing Turbulence in the Seas 77:16
 - D1 {16} The waters saw You, O God;
 - D2 The waters saw You, they were in anguish;
 - D3 The deeps also trembled.
- C2 Causing Tempest in the Skies 77:17
 - D1 Rainstorm: {17} The clouds poured out water;
 - D2 Thunder: The skies gave forth a sound;
 - D3 Lightning: Your arrows flashed here and there.

- C3 Causing Turmoil upon the Earth 77:18
 - D1 Roaring Whirlwind: {18} The sound of Your thunder was in the whirlwind;
 - D2 Flashing Lightning: The lightnings lit up the world;
 - D3 Reverberating Earthquake: The earth trembled and shook.

B2 The Sovereignty of Elohim in Nature on Behalf of His People 77:19-20

- C1 His Unfathomable Rescue of Israel through the Sea 77:19
 - D1 {19} Your way was in the sea ¹
 - D2 And Your paths in the mighty waters,
 - D3 And Your footprints may not be known.
- C2 Leading His People like a Flock 77:20
 - D1 {20} You led Your people like a flock
 - D2 By the hand of Moses and Aaron.

EXPANDED ANALYSIS OF PSALM 77

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¹ 77:19 - Your way was in the sea: A reference to God's preservation of Israel at the expense of the Egyptian army through the Red Sea.
