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A1 A CALL TO PRAISE 81:1-5

B1 The Imperative of the Call 81:1-3

- C1 With Voice 81:1
 - D1 {1} Sing for joy to God our strength;
 - D2 Shout joyfully to the God of Jacob.
- C2 With Festive Instrumentation 81:2-3
 - D1 $\{2\}$ Raise a song,
 - D2 strike the timbrel,
 - D3 The sweet sounding lyre with the harp. 81:2
 - D4 $\{3\}$ Blow the trumpet 81:3
 - E1 at the new moon,
 - E2 At the full moon, on our feast day.

B2 The Scriptural Basis for the Call 81:4-5

- C1 The Terminology 81:4-5a
 - D1 $\{4\}$ For it is a statute for Israel,
 - D2 An ordinance of the God of Jacob. 81:4
 - D3 {5} He established it for a testimony in Joseph 81:5b

¹ Title - Festive: Traditionally thought to be a psalm used in connection with the Feast of Tabernacles.

² Superscription - Gittith: Used only in Psalms 8, 81, and 84, Gittith is a feminine adjective derived from the noun Gath, and means "wine-press." It is also one of the five principal cities of the Philistines. The three main conjectures are therefore that this is a term connected with the vintage (which coincided with the Feast of Tabernacles), or with the Ark's journey from the Gittite's house to Jerusalem (2 Sam. 6:11), or with an instrument (or tune?) which took its name from Gath" (Derek Kidner, *Tyndale Old Testament Commentaries*, Psalms 1-72, Introduction, p. 56.)

 - D1 The activity of Elohim: When he went throughout the land of Egypt.
 - D2 The new relationship-name of Elohim: I heard a language that I did not know: ³

A2 GOD'S REDEMPTION OF ISRAEL IN EGYPT 81:6-7

B1 His Freeing Israel from Slavery in Egypt 81:6

- C1 $\{6\}$ "I relieved his shoulder of the burden,
- C2 His hands were freed from the basket.

B2 His Protecting Israel on the Shores of the Red Sea 81:7a

- C1 $\{7\}$ "You called in trouble and I rescued you;
- C2 I answered you in the hiding place of thunder;
- **B3** His Provision of Water from the Rock at Rephidim: I proved you at the waters of Meribah. Selah. 81:7b (Ex. 17:1-7)

A3 GOD'S WARNING ACCOMPANIED BY PROMISE 81:8-10

B1 God's Admonition 81:8

- C1 {8} "Hear, O My people, and I will admonish you;
- C2 O Israel, if you would listen to Me! Selah.

B2 God's Command of Allegiance 81:9

- C1 $\{9\}$ "Let there be no strange god among you;
- C2 Nor shall you worship any foreign god.

B3 Yahweh's promise of Satisfaction Based on Past Performance

- C1 $\{10\}$ "I, the LORD, am your God,
- C2 Who brought you up from the land of Egypt;
- C3 Open your mouth wide and I will fill it.

³ 81:5 - I heard a language that I did not know: This difficult text evidently refers to Israel's beginning to know God in a new way through His name Yahweh, the Self-Existent One who becomes Israel's Covenantal Redeemer from Bondage (Ex. 3:14-15).

A4 GOD'S INDUCEMENT OF HIS DISOBEDIENT PEOPLE 81:11-16

B1 Israel's Disobedience 81:11

- C1 {11} "But My people did not listen to My voice,
- C2 And Israel did not obey Me.

B2 God's Resultant Judgment 81:12

- C1 $\{12\}$ "So I gave them over to the stubbornness of their heart,
- C2 To walk in their own devices.

B3 God's Yearning for Attentive Obedience 81:13

- C1 For Listening: $\{13\}$ "Oh that My people would listen to Me,
- C2 For Obedient Lifestyle: That Israel would walk in My ways!

B4 God's Conditional Promise of Judgment against Israel's Enemies 81:14

- C1 Subduing Israel's Enemies; *{14}* "I would quickly subdue their enemies
- C2 Rebuffing Israel's Adversaries: And turn My hand against their adversaries.

B5 God's Punishment of the Hypocrites 81:15

- C1 The Pretense of Those Who Hate Yahweh: $\{15\}$ "Those who hate the LORD would pretend obedience ⁴ to Him,
- C2 The Punishment of Those Who Hate Yahweh: And their time *of punishment* would be forever.

B6 God's Promise of Pampering of His People 81:16

- C1 With Fine Wheat: $\{16\}$ "But I would feed you with the finest of the wheat,
- C2 With Superb Honey: And with honey from the rock I would satisfy you."

⁴ 81:15 - pretend obedience to Him: NIV reads "cringe before Him."
