A1 THE SUPREME GLORY OF YAHWEH 115:1-8

- B1 The Ascription of Glory to Yahweh 115:1
 - C1 The Ascription of Glory
 - D1 {1} Not to us, O LORD, not to us,
 - D2 But to Your name give glory
 - C2 The Reasons for Glory
 - D1 Because of Your lovingkindness,
 - D2 because of Your truth.

B2 The Superiority of Yahweh to the Idols of the Nations 115:2-8

- C1 The Contrast of Essence 115:2-4
 - D1 The charge of the nations: Israel's God, invisible, is therefore non-existent! {2} Why should the nations say, "Where, now, is their God?" 115:2
 - D2 The truth of the matter: Israel's God is the Transcendent Sovereign, while the nations' gods are mere metal manufactured by men! 115:3-4
 - E1 The transcendent sovereignty of Israel's God 115:3
 - F1 {3} But our God is in the heavens;
 - F2 He does whatever He pleases.
 - E2 The manufactured matter of the nations' gods 115:4
 - F1 Their essence metallic idols: {4} Their idols are silver and gold,
 - F2 Their origin manufactured by man: The work of man's hands.

¹ Title - Her: In Hebrew the nation of Israel is designated by a masculine pronoun, but in English, any nation is designated by a feminine pronoun.

- C2 The Charge of Impotence against the Nations' gods 115:5-7
 - D1 Mute: {5} They have mouths, but they cannot speak; 115:5
 - D2 Blind: They have eyes, but they cannot see;
 - D3 Deaf: {6} They have ears, but they cannot hear; 115:6
 - D4 Unable to smell: They have noses, but they cannot smell;
 - D5 Unfeeling: {7} They have hands, but they cannot feel; 115:7
 - D6 Immobile: They have feet, but they cannot walk;
 - D7 Soundless: They cannot make a sound with their throat.
- C3 The Projected Impotence of Those Who Trust in Their Impotent gods 115:8
 - D1 The doomed destiny: {8} Those who make them will become like them,
 - D2 The doomed trust: Everyone who trusts in them.

B1 The Call to Israel to Trust in Yahweh 115:9-13

- C1 The Call to Trust 115:9-11
 - D1 {9} O Israel, trust in the LORD; He is their help and their shield. 115:9
 - D2 {10} O house of Aaron, trust in the LORD; He is their help and their shield. 115:10
 - D3 {11} You who fear the LORD, trust in the LORD; He is their help and their shield. 115:11
- C2 The Assurance of Trust 115:12-13
 - D1 Blessing because of Yahweh's awareness: {12} The LORD has been mindful of us; He will bless us; 115:12
 - D2 Blessing in respect to the entire ethnic entity of Israel
 - E1 He will bless the house of Israel;
 - E2 He will bless the house of Aaron.

- D3 Blessing encompassing all those who fear Yahweh 115:13
 - E1 The condition of blessing: {13} He will bless those who fear the LORD,
 - E2 The complete scope of blessing
 - F1 The small
 - F2 together with the great.

B2 The Pledge of Israel to Trust in Yahweh 115:14-18

- C1 The Prayer, in Faith, for Blessing 115:14-16
 - D1 The request for inter-generational material blessing: {14} May the LORD give you increase, You and your children. 115:14
 - D2 The request for blessing commensurate with the universal Sovereignty of Yahweh: {15} May you be blessed of the LORD, Maker of heaven and earth. (115:15) 115:15-16
 - E1 The jurisdiction of Yahweh over the heavens: {16} The heavens are the heavens of the LORD, 115:16
 - E2 Yahweh's delegation of jurisdiction over the earth to men: But the earth He has given to the sons of men.
- C2 The Promise, in Faith, of Praise 115:17-18
 - D1 The stifling of praise 115:17
 - E1 {17} The dead do not praise the LORD,
 - E2 Nor *do* any who go down into silence;
 - D2 The vow, in faith, of eternal praise: {18} But as for us, we will bless the LORD From this time forth and forever. 115:18
 - D3 The concluding call to praise: Praise the LORD!
