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C3 The heavenly worship of the Redeeming Lamb worthy to open the Seven-Sealed Scroll of Judgment as the Lion of Judah **5**

**B2 The Great Tribulation: The Time of the Wrath of God and the Lamb upon the Earth 6 - 19:4**

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**B7 Epilogue:** The blessing on those who read; the call to holiness; the invitation to salvation; the warning against tampering with the book; farewells **22:6-21**

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#### **B 1 Christ's Message to the Church in Ephesus: Having left your first love, repent, or I'll remove your lampstand 2:1-7**

- C 1 His constituency: the church in Ephesus 2:1a
- C 2 His characterization of Himself: holder of seven stars walking among seven golden lampstands 2:1b



- C 3 His commendation: For their loyal, diligent service and hatred of evil 2:2-3
- C 4 His criticism: their departure from their first love 2:4
- C 5 His caution: To remember, repent, and re-perform, lest their lampstand be removed 2:5
- C 6 His renewed commendation: Their hatred of the deeds of the Nicolaitans 2:6
- C 7 His challenge: to listen to the Spirit, overcome, and thus eat of the tree of life 2:7

**B 2 Christ's Message to the Church in Smyrna:** Knowing your tribulation, I ask you not to fear the ten days' tribulation which you will suffer **2:8-11**

- C 1 His constituency: The church in Smyrna 2:8a
- C 2 His characterization of Himself: The first and last, resurrected 2:8b
- C 3 His commendation: His awareness of their suffering, opposition, yet true wealth 2:9
- C 4 His comfort -- His alerting them to coming trials 2:10a
- C 5 His conditional promise: Faithfulness even to martyrdom inherits the crown of life 2:10b
- C 6 His challenge: Listen to the Spirit, overcome and not be hurt by the second death 2:11

**B 3 His Message to the Church in Pergamum:** Though you did not deny my faith, you must repent of the teaching of Balaam (immorality) and of the Nicolaitans (rule of the people) or I'll war against you **2:12-17**

- C 1 His constituency: The church in Pergamum 2:12a
- C 2 His characterization of Himself as the one with the sharp, two-edged sword 2:12b
- C 3 His commendation of their loyalty in light of their hostile surroundings 2:13
- C 4 His criticism of those promoting the teaching of Balaam and of the Nicolaitans 2:14-15
- C 5 His caution to repent or else He will come and war against them 2:16
- C 6 His challenge to listen to the Spirit and overcome, inheriting hidden manna and a white stone 2:17

**B 4 His Message to the Church in Thyatira:** Knowing your good works, carry on, yet I warn you not to tolerate the Jezebel-like "prophetess" among you, whom I will dispose of for her immorality **2:18-29**

- C 1 His constituency: The church in Thyatira 2:18a
- C 2 His characterization of Himself as the Son of God with flaming eyes and feet like burnished bronze 2:18b
- C 3 His commendation of their persevering, increasing deeds performed in love and faith 2:19
- C 4 His criticism -- their tolerance of seductive Jezebel, the target of Christ's judgment 2:20-23
- C 5 His consolation 2:24
- C 6 His caution: Hold fast what they have until He come. 2:25
- C 7 His challenge: His challenge to listen to the Spirit and conquer to the end, inheriting rulership over the nations and the morning star 2:26-29

**B 5 Christ's Message to the Church in Sardis:** Your deeds are incomplete: unless you repent, I will come on you as a thief **3:1-6**

- C 1 His constituency: The church in Sardis 3:1a
- C 2 His characterization of Himself: Possessor of the seven Spirits of God and the seven stars 3:1b
- C 3 His empty commendation: Their reputation of vibrancy, but actual lifelessness 3:1c
- C 4 His criticism: His command to strengthen what remains, for their works are incomplete 3:2
- C 5 His caution: To remember what they've heard and repent, else He'll come upon them as a thief! 3:3
- C 6 His consolation: The few unsoiled, worthy will walk with Him in white 3:4
- C 7 His challenge to listen to the Spirit; that He who conquers will be clothed in white, his name left in the book of life, his name confessed before His Father and the angels 3:5-6

**B 6 Christ's Message to the Church in Philadelphia:** I have set before you an unshuttable door of service and I will keep you from the tribulation which is to try the whole earth **3:7-13**

- C 1 His constituency: The church in Philadelphia 3:7a
- C 2 His characterization of Himself as holy, true, and possessing the uncircumventable key of David 3:7b

- C 3 His commendation of their deeds, minimal strength, and loyalty; his authorization of an open door of service and vindication before unbelieving Jews 3:8-9
- C 4 His consolation: Their preservation from the world-wide Great Tribulation because of their obedient perseverance 3:10
- C 5 His caution: Because He is coming quickly, they are to hold fast what they have so that no one takes away their crown 3:11
- C 6 His challenge to listen to the Spirit; that he who conquers will be made a secure pillar in God's temple, inscribed with God's name and new Jerusalem 3:12-13

**B 7 Christ's Message to the Church in Laodicea:** I warn you, who are luke-warm, to invite me into your lives, lest I spit you out **3:14-22**

- C 1 His constituency: The church in Laodicea 3:14a
- C 2 His characterization of Himself as the Amen, the faithful and true Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God 3:14b
- C 3 His empty commendation of their deeds -- neither hot nor cold 3:15
- C 4 His caustic criticism: because of their tepidness, He will spit them out 3:16
- C 5 His caution: Because of their ignorance of their wretched condition (poor, blind, and naked), He counsels them to repent and buy of Him gold, white clothing, and eye salve, for whom He loves, He disciplines 3:17-19
- C 6 His invitation to them to open the door and allow Him to enter for fellowship 3:20
- C 7 His challenge to listen to the Spirit; that he who conquers will sit with Him in His throne 3:21-22

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- C 2 The heavenly worship around the throne of the Creator God 4:2-11
  - D 1 His transportation to the throne in heaven 4:2
  - D 2 His description of the resplendent appearance of One sitting upon the throne 4:2c-3a
  - D 3 His description of that which surrounded the throne: 24 elders and four intelligent creatures 4:3b-8a
  - D 4 The praise by the four creatures and 24 elders of the One upon the throne 4:8b-11

- C 3 The heavenly worship of the Redeeming Lamb worthy to open the Seven-Sealed Scroll of Judgment as the Lion of Judah 5
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  - D 4 The worship directed toward the Lamb 5:8-12
  - D 5 The worship directed toward God and the Lamb 5:13-14

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- D 3 The third trumpet -- "Wormwood" judgment upon fresh water: A third of fresh water becomes poisonous 8:10-11
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  - D 3 The editorial comment on the preparation of the bride in righteousness 19:8
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- C 2 The presentation (unveiling) of the holy Warrior-King of Kings and His armies prior to His striking the nations with his sword and ruling with His iron rod 19:11-16

C 3 The crushing victory of the Word of God over the Beast and False Prophet 19:17-21

D 1 The invitation to the great supper of God -- the flesh of warriors -- as delivered by an angel standing in the sun 19:17-18

D 2 The demise of the beast and his regime! Christ's seizure of the beast and false prophet and deposition of them into the lake of fire; His execution of the beast's army, leaving it as carrion on which the birds feed! 19:19-21

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C 2 RESURRECTION AND REIGN: The judgment and resurrection of Tribulation saints to be priests who are also co-regents with Christ 20:4-6

D 1 The reference to thrones and judgment (Possibly the 24 elders, or at least the 12 apostles, appointed to sit on thrones and judge the 12 tribes of Israel – Luke 22:29-30) 20:4

D 2 Sacrifice for Jesus rewarded by resurrection and co-regency 20:4

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D 2 Satan's tactic – To deceive the nations of the earth 20:8a

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- C 4 JUDGMENT – The Great White Throne Judgment of the wicked dead 20:11-15
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    - E 1 The identity of the defendants: the dead, small and great 20:12
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  - D 2 The glory of the city: Divine glory, as of crystal-clear jasper 21:11
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- D 5 The construction materials of the city: The wall of jasper, the city of pure, transparent gold, the foundation stones adorned with precious stones, the gates composed of single pearls, the city street of pure, transparent gold! 21:18-21
- D 6 The worship in the city: God and the Lamb constitute its temple 21:22
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- D 13 The state of nature in the city -- The absence of any curse 22:3
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
