² The Church in Laodicea. Obviously this was a first century church. But it also, I believe, speaks either of the Church at large as it will exist just before the Rapture, or else the visible, professing church as it exists in the Tribulation, having missed the Rapture. If the latter view is correct it refers to the organized church, the members of whom were not truly believers. Notice that there are no bona fide commendations for this church. It sounds like a church utterly in need of salvation!
