¹ 8:6 - hail and fire mixed with blood: Hail we can understand. Will the fire be lightning? Evidently not, for the word is *pur* (4442, fire), not *astrapē* (796, lightning). Hail and fire are reminiscent of the 7th plague (Exod. 9:13-35). The blood in the plagues of Egypt was literal in the 1st plague (Exod. 7:14-25). As the text reads, it is also literal here in the 1st Trumpet Judgment.

² 8:8 - something like a great mountain burning with fire: Some have suggested this catastrophe will be an asteroid that strikes the sea. Asteroids, variously consisting of rock, metal, and ice, are not burning, but they certainly would burn as they entered the earth's atmosphere. The largest known asteroid is Ceres (diameter of 940 km or 587.5 miles). Vesta has a diameter of 530 km (331 miles). An object the size of either of these striking the sea would generate horrific consequences.

³ 8:8 - a third of the sea became blood: The text does not say that the sea became *like* or *as* blood. Rather, it became blood. This will be a supernatural event that has a precedent (Exod. 7:14-22), but that will occur on a vastly larger scale.

⁴ 8:9 - a third of the creatures ... in the sea ... died: The effects of this plague on marine life will be catastrophic beyond anything since the Great Flood (Genesis 7-8).

 $^{^{5}}$ 8:9 - a third of the ships were destroyed: This can hardly be a localized catastrophe. No phenomenon known today can cause such far-reaching devastation.

⁷ 8:13 - The oldest Greek manuscripts (MSS) read "eagle," but the Textus Receptus (TR), the Edition of the Greek Text published and revised between 1516 and 1535, incorporated a later variant, "angel" (similar spelling), probably because it made more sense to the copyists that an angel, rather than
