	3.	Father Jacob sent Joseph to check upon his brothers (Gen. 37:12-14). How did they show their hatred of him (Gen. 37:18-28?
	4.	How did the brothers deceive their father? (Gen. 37:31-33)
	5.	Who in Egypt bought Joseph as a slave? (Gen. 39:1)
	6.	He was the captain of the bodyguard of the Egyptian King. What was the Egyptian King's title (Gen. 39:1)?
	7.	Joseph succeeded in the house of the captain because the Lord was with him. Unfortunately (at least in human terms), the captain's wife was not a nice woman. How did she tempt Joseph (Gen. 39:7-12)
