## F. What we Christians need to know as we ourselves face danger. 2 Cor. 11:23-28

- 1. Be aware of the many dangers from which God delivered Paul.
  - a. Imprisoned
  - b. Beaten countless times
    - 1) 5 times 39 lashes
    - 2) 3 times beaten with rods
  - Stoned once
  - d. 3 times shipwrecked; a night and a day in the ocean
  - e. Dangers from rivers
  - f. Dangers from robbers
  - g. Sleepless nights
  - h. Often without food
  - i. Facing cold and exposure
- 2. God will walk with us through the valley of the shadow of death. Psalm 23:4-5a
- 3. The LORD provides safety. Psalm 12:5
- 4. No danger can separate us from Jesus' love! Romans 8:35, 38-39
- 5. Since God is our refuge, we must not fear. Psalm 46:1-3
- 6. Since the LORD provides safety, we can sleep at night. Psalm 4:8

Whenever we face danger, we can sleep at night, because God is the one who keeps us safe.
