## A. The Prophecy of Zechariah. Zechariah 9:9-10

1. The humble entrance of the King. 9:9
  - a. This king would be the king of Israel.
  - b. His appearance was to be cause for great joy!
  - c. This king would be a just king.
  - d. This king would bring salvation.
  - e. This king would be a humble king.
  - f. This king would be so humble he would ride in on a donkey, not a horse!
2. The peaceful reign of the King. 9:10
  - a. This king would demilitarize Israel.
  - b. This king would offer peace to the nations.
  - c. This king would rule over all the land of Israel, from the Mediterranean to the Dead Sea.
  - d. This king would rule from the River Euphrates to the ends of the earth.

## B. The Prophecy Found in Psalm 118:22-26

1. The rejected stone becomes the chief corner stone. 22-24
  - a. Israel's leaders would reject a ruler. 22a
  - b. Yahweh would make this rejected ruler the foundation of the whole nation. 22b-23
  - c. That day would be cause for great rejoicing in Israel. 24
2. Israel's plea for salvation. 25-26
  - a. Israelis plead with Yahweh for salvation of the nation. 25a
  - b. Israelis plead for national prosperity and well-being. 25b
  - c. Israelis bless the Messianic ruler who will come in Yahweh's name in answer to their prayers. 26a
  - d. Worshiping Israelis bless one another from the temple. 26b

  - b. The crowd instantly understood he was coming as the Messiah.
  - c. The crowd praised Jesus with a Messianic psalm.
  - d. The people in Jerusalem said he was merely a prophet.
  - e. If Jesus literally fulfilled Zech. 9:9, one day He will literally fulfill Zech. 9:10.

2. Behold your King! 19:8-16
3. Observations.
  - a. A minority of Jews believed Jesus was the Messiah.
  - b. A majority of Jews believed Jesus was merely a prophet.
  - c. Jealous Jewish leaders brought false charges against Jesus.
  - d. The Roman government thrice declared Jesus innocent.
  - e. The Jewish leaders black-mailed Pilate.
  - f. Yielding to political pressure, Pilate executed Jesus in order to save his own job.
  - g. Each person must choose whether Jesus is his king.
  - h. To remain apathetic is to favor his execution.
